RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MANSFIELD SUPPORTING THE CLICK IT OR TICKET MOBILIZATION OF MAY 21-JUNE 3, 2018

WHEREAS, a large percentage of the motor vehicle occupants killed in traffic crashes were not wearing a seat belt; and

WHEREAS, use of a seat belt remains the most effective way to avoid death and serious injury in a motor vehicle crash; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey will participate in the nationwide Click It or Ticket seat belt mobilization from May 21 to June 3, 2018 in an effort to raise awareness and increase seat belt usage through a combination of enforcement and education; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Highway Traffic Safety has set a goal of increasing the seat belt usage rate statewide by 1.5% from 95.5% through a targeted two-week seat belt enforcement campaign from May 21 to June 3, 2018; and

WHEREAS, a further increase in seat belt usage in New Jersey will save lives on our roadways;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Township of Mansfield hereby declares it's support for the Click It or Ticket seat belt mobilization program both locally and nationally from May 21 to June 3, 2018, pledges to increase awareness of the mobilization and the benefits of seat belt use and accepts a grant for the same in the amount of \$5500.00 to be used for 100 hours of overtime enforcement (at \$55/hour) during the two week mobilization period.
