CLERK'S REPORT

<u>Mt. Bethel Church Grant</u> – Packet has a new grant for Mt. Bethel Church. The resolution is the same amount that we'd have to contribute therefore we will be able to use the original resolution that was passed in May. Ms. Hrebenak asked if the Committee had reviewed it and were okay with the application going through.

Another item is the discussion in Executive dealing with a contractual matter for the HVAC.

<u>Game Farm Sign</u> – The NJDEP office that handles leasing called, they have finally finished reviewing the contracts for the barn at the game farm. The contracts should be received within the next few weeks for the Committee to review.

There is also a question of who will maintain the signage by the game farm and the railroad wreck. Mr. Lavery suggested sending a letter to the State since it's their property to see if they are going to maintain. Depending on their answer, the Committee will then make a decision for the Township to maintain.

FINANCE REPORT

<u>Airport Road Funding</u> – On tonight's agenda there is an introduction for a Capital Ordinance to appropriate the DOT funding for Airport Road.

Expense Reports – In the packet is the budget for the Committee to see where we are through the first six (6) months.

<u>Purchasing Manual</u> – Changes to the manual were made with the State threshold increases for bidding and quotes. If the Committee approves, it can be voted on at the next meeting. The QPA maximums are \$44,000 for bids and \$6,600 for quotes. The \$17,500 stays in place for Pay-To-Play – once you hit that threshold it requires vendors to provide information about contributions to elected officials.

EMPLOYEES' REPORTS

<u>Municipal Lien Letters</u> – The tax office would like to mail out letters to properties that have municipal liens on them to generate money. The letter will explain the process of how to redeem properties with municipal

liens and would state we are looking to foreclose on properties that have liens. If the Committee agrees, we will also compile a list of approximately 12 to 15 properties because we have a budget of \$20,000, we can do a resolution for the next meeting or the meeting after that. We will also start compiling a list of IN REM foreclosures. The Committee was asked for insight if the tax office should proceed and start with the letters going out to property owners.

Mr. McGuiness made a motion to proceed with mailing the letters to potential foreclosure properties, which was seconded by Mrs. Mora Dillon.

<u>Historical Scavenger Hunt</u> – The Green Team put together a rough draft of the Historical Scavenger Hunt. The sample in the packet shows visual aids and additional information and when residents go on the website, there will be more information about certain properties. Mrs. Fascenelli asked if there were any questions and if the Team should proceed as started. Mayor Watters stated it was interesting. The Green Team will move forward on it.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

<u>Janes Chapel Road</u> – Application was made to the DOT for the SSGE Program Second Phase of Janes Chapel Road for additional funds for the entire road. The resolution for it is on the agenda and once it's passed tonight, Mr. Kastrud will forward it to our representative at the DOT.

<u>Watters and Heiser Roads</u> – The paperwork is completed to be submitted and Mr. Kastrud does need a few items from the CFO to break down Watters and Heiser Roads for the different payments that were made to the contractors. Once he has that, the paperwork will go in, but it has to be signed by Mayor Watters. Mr. Kastrud will work on getting the money by the end of July.

<u>Stormwater Standards</u> – A new ordinance will have to be passed for the new stormwater standards dealing with draining lids and replacing them during certain paving projects.

Mayor Watters asked if everything has been completed to file the application for Janes Chapel Road. Mr. Kastrud stated the application was filed last month, it is complete. Once the resolution is passed tonight, he will send it to the State.

BUILDINGS & GROUNDS

<u>Lobby Painting</u> – Mr. Snyder received three (3) quotes for painting the Municipal Building Lobby from the woodwork down. He will give them to Ms. Hrebenak to share with the Committee.

<u>Parking Lot</u> – Mr. Snyder received two (2) quotes on the parking lot expansion. He had called two additional contractors who have not responded. He will try to find another for a quote. Mayor Watters said we are not required to get a third quote. Mr. Snyder will give the quotes to Ms. Hrebenak to share with the Committee.

<u>Paving</u> – The DPW paved Ridge, Slope, Hemlock, Valley and Washburn roads and came in a little over \$8,000 under budget.

Catch Basins – Continuing work on catch basins and our patching whenever they can.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MANSFIELD, WARREN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY APPROPRIATING \$156,000.00 FOR THE ROAD RECONSTRUCTION OF AIRPORT ROAD

WHEREAS, there is a need for Road Reconstruction of Airport Road;

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Mansfield, Warren County, New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The amount of \$156,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the New Jersey Department of Transportation Municipal Aid Grant.
- 2. There is no debt incurred by this Ordinance.

ORDINANCE 2020 - 09

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MANSFIELD, COUNTY OF WARREN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF A DONATION OF LANDS LOCATED AT BLOCK 2613, LOT 1.02 AND BLOCK 2614, LOT 9, PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:12-5

WHEREAS, Ronald S. Milkowski holds title to certain property located in Mansfield Township known as Block 2613, Lot 1.02 and Block 2614, Lot 9; and

WHEREAS, there are outstanding taxes due on both Lots; and

WHEREAS, Ronald S. Milkowski has offered to donate said property to the Township of Mansfield; and

WHEREAS, a contract for the conveyance of the property will be prepared for execution by Mr. Milkowski and the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township desires to accept the property in lieu of the cost of pursuing a tax foreclosure.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Mansfield, County of Warren, State of New Jersey that the Township is hereby authorized to accept title to the aforementioned property, subject to all contract contingencies being satisfied, including without limitation review and acceptance of the title binder.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Mayor and Township Clerk of the Township of Mansfield are hereby authorized to execute all necessary documents, including the Contract of Sale in order to obtain title to said property.

Section 2 - Severability

The various parts, sections and clauses of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any part, sentence, paragraph, section or clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Section 3 - Repealer

Any ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to their inconsistencies only.

Section 4 - Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect as required by law.
