CLERK'S REPORT

<u>State House Commission</u> – Ms. Hrebenak attended the virtual meeting on Tuesday. Approval of the Rockport Barn. \$20.00 for a 20-year contract.

<u>Recreation Property Farm Lease Bid</u> – Bids were received and opened today. Award went to the farmer who is presently leasing - \$151.00 per acre for a total of \$7,050 per year.

<u>CCA</u> – Alternate funding to municipalities. Application needs to be completed and a resolution needs to be passed. Funds go to counties that did not receive funds.

<u>Building Opening</u> – Guidance from the Governor's office on building openings will be forth coming.

<u>Old Business</u> – This item will now be listed on the agenda. Committee decided it will be listed on the Committee agenda only.

FINANCE REPORT

2019 Audit – The auditor will make a presentation tonight on the results of the audit.

 3^{rd} Quarter Revenues – A spreadsheet has been included in the Committee packet for the 3^{rd} quarter of this year and last year. All is in good shape. Shortfall in court revenues is minimal and absorbed by other areas that have increased such as interest on investments.

<u>Memorial Bench</u> – Chief Reilly explained that the wife of Thomas Roth wanted to put a bench under the tree that was planted in honor of her husband. Committee liked the idea. Mrs. Mora Dillon suggested putting a plaque on the bench.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Mr. Kastrud reported:

Heiser and Watters Road – additional paperwork will be submitted tomorrow.

<u>Airport Road</u> – plans are complete. Mr. Kastrud and Ms. Hrebenak to get into standard boiler plate for municipalities.

<u>Meadows Flow</u> – Mr. Kastrud has not received the sewer flow from the Meadows' environmental engineer, but has received the amounts from Bill Hotz of 30-40 gallons. New Jersey American Water is going to do readings from a few houses. To date, 43 houses are sold with 11 in construction. The Club House limit was at 60 and they are at 54.

TOWNSHIP OF MANSFIELD COUNTY OF WARREN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY RESOLUTION 2020-144 GOVERNING BODY CERTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL AUDIT

Mansfield Township Committee Meeting October 14, 2020

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions, and

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2018 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Municipal Clerk pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A;5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and,

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Financial Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and,

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall by resolution certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations, and,

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body has personally reviewed as a minimum the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations, as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and,

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than fortyfive days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and,

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board, and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52, to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date

fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Township Committee of the Township of Mansfield, hereby states that it has complied with N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5 and does hereby submit a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance. I, Dena Hrebenak, Municipal Clerk of the Township of Mansfield, Warren County, New Jersey do hereby certify the foregoing to be a true and exact copy of a resolution adopted by the Mansfield Township Committee at the Regular meeting held on October 14, 2020.

Ordinance No. 2020-13

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 360 "ADMINISTRATION AND PROCEDURES," ARTICLE III "ADMINISTRATION," SECTION 14 "HEARINGS" AND CHAPTER 362 "SUBDIVISION AND SITE PLAN REVIEW," ARTICLE III "MAJOR SUBDIVISION," SECTION 16 "PUBLICATION OF DECISION" OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MANSFIELD REQUIRING APPLICANTS TO PUBLISH NOTICE OF DECISIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Mansfield, in the

County of Warren and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 360, Administration and Procedures, Article III, Administration,

Section 14, Hearings, Subsection I, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"§ 360-14(I) Upon adoption of a resolution for an application for development, the Applicant shall publish a brief notice of the Board's decision within ten (10) days of the adoption of the resolution in the official newspaper of the Township or in a newspaper of general circulation in the Township and provide proof of publication of notice to the Secretary of Board. If an applicant fails to publish notice as herein required or provide proof of publication within thirty (30) days of the adoption of a resolution, the Secretary of the Board shall publish such notice, the cost of which shall be charged against the applicant's escrow. The period of time in which an appeal of the decision may be made shall run from the first publication of the decision, whether arranged by the Township or the applicant." SECTION 2. Chapter 362, Subdivision and Site Plan Review, Article III, Major Subdivision,

Section 16, Publication of decision, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"§ 362-16	Publication of decision. A brief notice of the decision shall be published
	in the manner provided in § 360-14(I)."

SECTION 3. This Ordinance may be renumbered for codification purposes.

SECTION 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with any part

of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in such conflict or inconsistent.

SECTION 5. In the event that any section, part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held

to be unenforceable or invalid by any court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this

Ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so held unenforceable or invalid.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by

law.
