# **CLERK'S REPORT**

Mrs. Orlando reported:

<u>Zoning Officer</u> – Met with the Washington Township construction office and our fire official where they discussed the more concerning town zoning issues. He will be at the next Committee Meeting.

<u>Comcast</u> – Emergency wiring is complete. Cable is run into the building. End of this month beginning of May for the internal wiring to switch to fiber optics for the security upgrade.

<u>Raffles</u> – Received two applications – one from St. Theodore Church, the other from Tri-County Ladies' Auxiliary. All paperwork is in order.

<u>Broad Band Availability</u> – An email was received from the County that the State is remapping for more broad band availability. We need to let them know where we have no internet. <u>SWAC Meeting</u> – Commissioner received Mr. Lavery's letter regarding the food processing facility and the SWAC and Dave Dech. Their attorney said we are incorrect in what we are saying. As of April 7<sup>th</sup>, there is no application to SWAC. They will take our letter into consideration if the application comes in.

<u>Single-Use Bags</u> – Mrs. Fascenelli gave a presentation to our Seniors about single-use plastic bags. She handed out Mansfield re-usable bags. As of May 4<sup>th</sup>, no plastic will be given out from businesses with over 2,500 sq ft. There will be paper bags in smaller stores. We have free-re-usable bags here for residents to pick up.

# TOWNSHIP OF MANSFIELD CALENDAR YEAR 2022 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14)

**WHEREAS,** the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by

ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

**WHEREAS,** N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Mansfield, in the County of Warren, finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 Budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

**WHEREAS,** the Township Committee hereby determine that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$51,814.61 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

**WHEREAS,** the Township Committee hereby determine that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Mansfield, in the County of Warren, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Mansfield shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$181,350.69, and that the CY 2022 municipal budget for the Township of Mansfield be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

# Emergency Resolution NJSA 40A:4-20 (Temporary Appropriations)

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40a:4-19 the Township Committee of the Township of Mansfield adopted a Resolution to provide temporary funds for the period from January 1, 2022 until the adoption of the Operating Budget for the Township of Mansfield, New Jersey; and

**WHEREAS**, additional appropriations will be required from April 13, 2022 until the adoption of the budget; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-20 provides that the governing body by two-thirds vote may make temporary emergency appropriations for any purpose for which appropriations may lawfully be made for the period between the beginning of the current fiscal year and the date of the adoption of the budget for said year;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Mansfield, Warren County, New Jersey, that:

1. The Township Committee by a two-thirds vote of its full membership hereby amends its temporary budget by making the following emergency temporary appropriations:

**WHEREAS,** the Mansfield Police Department wishes to apply for grant funding not to exceed \$24,220.00 to provide additional manpower hours for seatbelt enforcement, to combat distracted driving, to decrease drivers driving while intoxicated, and to increase driver education to save lives; and

**WHEREAS,** an enforcement crackdown is planned to reduce violations related to seatbelt usage, distracted drivers, and driving while intoxicated to reduce the number of crashes and potential fatalities related to these offenses; and

Highway Traffic Safety Click It or Ticket 2022 Seat Belt Mobilization

**WHEREAS,** the most effective device for preventing deaths and injuries in motor vehicle crashes remains the seat belt; and

**WHEREAS,** in 2019, New Jersey experienced nearly 4,000 crashes where an occupant was not wearing his or her seat belt, resulting in 108 fatalities.

**WHEREAS**, the most recent statewide survey, undertaken in June 2021, determined the seat belt usage rate in New Jersey to be 93.92%.

WHEREAS, Mansfield Township Police Department would like to participate in the 2022 Click It or Ticket Seat Belt Mobilization from May 23 – June 5, 2022 to reduce the number of unrestrained motor vehicle fatalities in the state and to increase the statewide seat belt observational rate (as detailed in the FY2022 New Jersey Highway Safety Plan) through targeted seat belt enforcement;

**NOW THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED** that the Township Committee of the Township of Mansfield, County of Warren, State of New Jersey authorizes applying for the Highway Traffic Safety Click It or Ticket 2022 Seat Belt Mobilization grant funding.
